



Frequently Asked Questions (FAQs) **“Earthlife Bagged Fertilizer Product”**

Why is it better than other fertilizers? It’s the sustainable choice. Unlike chemical fertilizers made from fossil fuels, the nutrients in Earthlife Fertilizer granules break down slowly, nurturing your lawn and garden from one season to the next. It is also produced locally, right here in New England.

Where is it produced?

It is produced at specially designed, licensed facilities located in Quincy, MA and North Andover, MA

What is it made from?

Earthlife Fertilizer is manufactured from the treated solids recovered from the wastewater of select Massachusetts communities. The material is treated at high temperatures in a controlled process to ensure it is safe, consistent and dry.

Is it safe?

Yes. Earthlife Fertilizer is extensively tested to ensure it meets the highest federal and state standards for such fertilizer products. It is a registered fertilizer with the VT Department of Agriculture.

What does it look like?

Earthlife Fertilizer is a fine textured, granulated fertilizer that looks like BB-sized pellets. It is dry and free-flowing, and can be applied using drop or broadcast spreader.

Is it used elsewhere?

Earthlife Fertilizer has been in use in bulk form by farmers, golf courses, turf managers and landscapers throughout New England for over 15 years. Due to the great results and response, we decided to make it available in easy to use 40# bags.

Is it approved for Organic gardening?

No, not at this time, but it is extensively tested to ensure it is consistent and safe. It is an ideal high organic matter fertilizer for use on lawns, shrubs, annuals, perennials and vegetable gardens.

Is it safe for lawns, pets, children, vegetables?

Yes. Earthlife Fertilizer is a safe and easy to use, non-burning fertilizer. Simply follow the same safe handling practices you would with any fertilizer, as detailed on the bag.

What NPK level does it offer?

4-2-0, 4% Nitrogen, 2% Phosphorus, 0% Potassium, + Iron. One 40lb bag will cover 2000 square feet.

How much do I use?

Lawns: One 40lb bag covers 2000 square feet.
Shrubs: 1 pint for transplanting small shrubs
Vegetables: 4 lbs per 100 square feet



Annual/Perennials: 5 lbs per 100 square feet when planting
3 lbs per 100 square feet after 12 weeks

Does it have an odor?

Like most natural fertilizers, you may notice a distinctive, musty odor when first applied. The odor should dissipate within a few days after application.
